Nancy Lowe Norman Marks, beloved wife of Dr. James B. Marks of Huntsville, passed away peacefully on Good Friday, April 6, 2007 at Methodist Hospital in Houston. She lost her battle against ovarian cancer that began in October of last year. She will be buried in Caldwell, Texas. She is preceded in death by her parents, William and Bess Norman, two sisters, Patricia Wermuth and Barbara Jones. She is survived by her husband, Dr. James B. Marks, her children daughter Susan McDermott of Houston, son and daughter-in-law James, Jr. and Diane Marks of Nashville, Tennessee, and daughter and son-in-law Elizabeth and Bart LeMay of Spring. She is survived by one brother, William Norman, Jr. of Sacramento, California. She also leaves behind four grandchildren, Christopher and Sara McDermott of Houston, and Grace and Sophia LeMay of Spring.
