Dr. Pauline Loveless Pauline Loveless was born November 12, 1921 in Payson, Utah to Martin Hill and Theresa (Richardson) Loveless and she passed away March 17, 2005 in Huntsville. She enjoyed a rich career as a teacher, university administrator, and counselor to students. She received her bachelor's degree in sociology from Weber State University and her doctoral degree in social work from the University of Utah. At Sam Houston State University she was a professor in the College of Criminal Justice from 1974 to 1991. She also served as assistant dean of undergraduate studies from 1982 until she retired in 1991. Pauline's academic influence also extended beyond the confines of Walker County and the state of Texas, evidenced by her years of membership in, and service to the Southwestern Association of Criminal Justice Educators, which included a term as president of the organization. Pauline's true legacy, however, will endure in the lives of her students, whom she served with patience, dedication, and love, and in her lifetime devotion to the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. To students, church members, and all others in need, her door was always open. Services will be held Tuesday, March 22, 2005 at 2:00 P.M. at the Church of Jesus Christ Latter Day Saints at 1803 19th. Street. Visitation was held Monday at Sam Houston Memorial Funeral Home. Interment will be held at a later date at the Payson City Cemetery in Payson, Utah. Dr. Loveless is survived by three sisters all of Salt Lake City, Utah; Afton Smith, Myrle L. Clark, and Patricia Maxine Krueger, many nieces, nephews, friends, students and colleagues.
