Phillip Andrew Wagner, born January 7, 1938, on the Mary Wagner property off Shepard Hill Road, passed away peacefully on February 7, 2025. He started his working career as a butcher at a local meat processing business in Conroe, TX. He eventually migrated to Houston, Texas where he worked in the meat delivery business. As time progressed, he worked at BSI, who supplied most of the insulation to the large buildings in downtown Houston. He finished his career working in maintenance at Willis High School.

Phillip is preceded in death by his mother Mary Wagner, his daughter Diane Wagner Konieczny, his sister Dorothy Swiech, and his brother-in-law Anton Swiech.

He spent many hours serving refreshments at the many events held at the K. C. Hall.

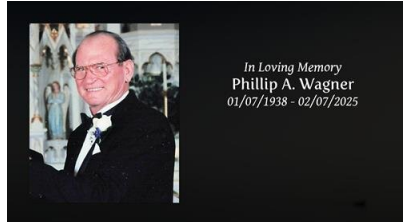
