Prentice Lamar Alexander took his last breath on earth and his first breath in the presence of his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ on Saturday, January 7, 2017, after 12 years of courageously battling cancer.

Prentice was born March 28, 1941, and spent most of his boyhood in Silsbee, Texas. He started working when he was 10 years old as a shoe shine boy, but was mostly known for his carpentry skills and construction company as well as being a local business owner. Prentice had a strong work and play ethic. He loved and enjoyed his family and friends, spoiled his grandkids, nieces and nephews, blessed others, traveled, and was intentional about making memories.
