



Prentiss Lee (P.L.) Moore

July 17, 1924 - September 14, 2010

Prentiss Lee Moore's spirit passed from his body to rest with our Lord on September 14th, 2010. P.L. was a beloved and loyal husband to his wife Edith Moore and a wonderful and caring father to his children, Prentiss Lee (deceased), James, and Kathie.

P.L. led a full life beginning with his birth in Enid, Oklahoma where he spent his early childhood. His family eventually moved to Memphis, Tennessee where he completed high school. Upon graduation he was accepted to from Baylor University where he earned a Bachelor of Arts degree. More prominent than his graduation from Baylor was his meeting, courting, and marriage to Edith Askew with whom he raised a family, remained in love with and true to until death did he part. After his graduation from Baylor, P.L. joined the Navy and was sent to Notre Dame where he was commissioned as an officer during World War II. P.L. pursued a law degree upon his return from the Navy before obligations led him into sales and ultimately a teaching career, from which he retired. After retirement, P.L. and Edith moved to Montgomery where he was a cattleman on their ranch near Dobbin. P.L.'s passion to serve his community manifested itself in many ways including serving as a councilman for the City of Montgomery.

P.L. loved sports, serving his community, life, his family, and his Lord. He spent the days of his later years playing golf at April Sound and talking with

his many friends. P.L. never met a stranger and always had a joke to share. He enjoyed laughing and people until the day he died.

P.L. was preceded in death by his eldest son, Prentiss Lee Moore III, and is survived by his wife of 65 years, Edith Moore, sister Jean Moore Harris, son James Monroe Moore (wife Sheryl), daughter Kathie Eileen Moore, granddaughter Madeline Mercedes Moore, numerous nephews and cousins.
