



Randolph "Randy" Thompson

November 15, 1966 - July 23, 2024

Randolph (Randy) Thompson, age 58, passed away on July 23, 2024, in Huntsville, Texas. He was born on November 15, 1966, in New Orleans, Louisiana. Randy had a heart for service. He served his country with honor, courage, and dedication for 27 years in the U.S. Navy, retiring as a Senior Chief Petty Officer in the Naval Aviation Maintenance Program in 2013. In 2020, Randy opened Granny Mary's Cajun-Asian Cuisine in honor of his grandmother. Randy derived great pleasure in sharing more than 60 years of family recipes by serving a delicious fusion menu that blended the flavors and dishes of his hometown of New Orleans and his wife's Filipino culture. Randy devoted his time in service to the greater Huntsville community as a volunteer for the Huntsville Meals on Wheels and by personally supporting food drives to help fill the empty pantries of the local mission and had recently hosted an ice cream giveaway for a local school. He was a member of the Walker County Chamber of Commerce and Huntsville Downtown Business Alliance and carved out time to mentor other small businesses. Randy embraced service to God through his work by supporting the Calvary Baptist Church in Florida and Grace Baptist Church in Huntsville. A social media post from a thoughtful supporter captured Randy's essence describing him as a person who cared about others and who gave selflessly to the community without ever asking for anything in return.

We celebrate Randy's life of service to God, country, community, and family. He leaves a legacy as a devoted husband to Mercedita (Mercy)Thompson. He

was a loving father to daughter Stasia and two sons Harry and Joshua Thompson. He was a grandfather to Eduardo Santiago and a stepfather to Nathan and Dean. He was preceded in death by his parents, Harry and Trudy Thompson, and late wife Heather Munro Thompson. Randy leaves behind a host of family, friends, and supporters and customers of Granny Mary's Cajun-Asian Cuisine.

Funeral services will be held on Monday, August 5, 2024, at 10:00 a.m., at Grace Baptist Church, 248 TX-19 in Huntsville, Texas, followed by military internment at 1:45 p.m., at the Houston National Cemetery, 10410 Veterans Memorial Drive in Houston, Texas. 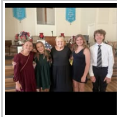

“ I would put myself at 8 and Randy at 12 yrs old. He is my 1st cousin, and we would mostly visit during family gatherings at Granny Mary’s house in Chalmette, La. He let me tag along in whatever he was getting into, and I trusted him because he was a generous and kind older brother type. He was also the youngest of his siblings. We regularly ventured around the marshy waterway near Granny’s home. Once, we came upon a bounty of lightning bugs in the tall grasses. Randy caught one, showed it to me, and then lightly smushed it on my face, leaving a florescent smudge. He laughed so hard at my disgust. It wasn’t done to me, but in a connective tribal kind of way. I’m sure this “hunting” and comradery continued until dusk or hunger called.

Separately, during those tween years, I recall we were playing in Granny’s yard one quiet afternoon. Randy found a dead crow and brought it inside and started to peck at Granny’s shoulder and make cawing sounds while she was at the kitchen sink. She turned to see what he was irritating her with, screamed at him, laughed, and chased us out. He was a stitch. Great low-level hooligan.

Even though we lost touch in our 20s/30s, we slipped back into a similar brotherly relationship later in life. I am glad to have known him twice and benefited from sharing joys, successes, and trials and tribulations together. Love and miss him.

And yes, our grandmother was a masterful chef. He honored her greatly.

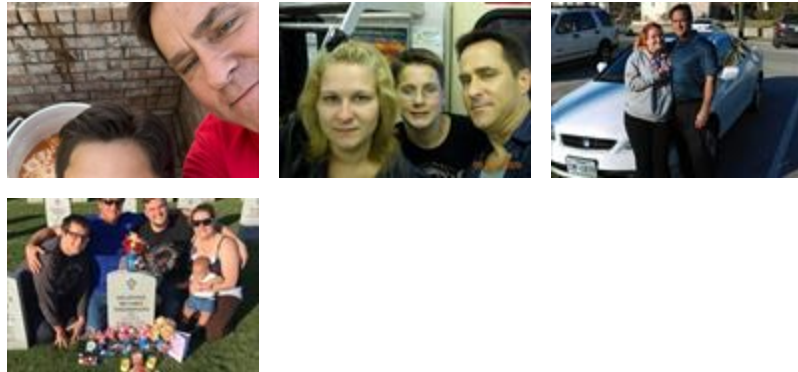
