He is survived by his devoted mother, Sue Jane of Centralia, Illinois, sisters, Connie J. Williams of Orlando, Florida and Nancy J. Davis of Maryville, Illinois, as well as two nieces and nephews. Steve moved to Huntsville in the mid-seventies and worked as the maintenance manager for First National Bank and later for the Texas Dept. of Criminal Justice and Texas Youth Commission. Steve retired from TYC in June 2011.
