



Ted Edward Michael

December 12, 1937 - December 19, 2008

Ted Edward Michael, died peacefully in his sleep on December 12th, 2008 at the age of 71. Ted was born on December 12, 1937 to Fred Michael and Monta Morgan in Payson, Oklahoma. After high school in Gainesville, he attended North Texas State University in Texas, graduating with a B.S. in Business. Following graduation he went to work for Chrysler Corporation in Allen while still attending college. Upon attaining his Masters Degree he went to work for the University of Texas Health Science Center in Dallas. In 1977 he left UTHSC and took a position at Sam Houston State to be closer to his brothers and sisters. Ted worked for Sam Houston State for 31 years as the Director of Human Resources. While at SHSU he also started and developed a Varsity Men's Soccer program and the Huntsville Youth Soccer Association, thereby bringing soccer to the city of Huntsville. Ted was highly respected at SHSU and had a very successful career. He was also the President of the Personnel Administrators of Texas Senior College Universities for many years. Ted was responsible for helping hundreds of young soccer players obtain scholarships and attend college. Ted was a strong and reliable leader and mentor who could be counted on to help anyone in need. He worked with and coached thousands of youth soccer players through camps, clubs, teams and associations. Ted was a loving, caring and giving husband, father and grandfather. He was very committed to his family and was there when anyone needed help. He is survived by his beloved wife Lisa and her daughter Alexandra, son Ted Michael Jr. of Huntsville, son Ronny Michael and

daughter-in-law Anita Laurentz and grand children Levi and Ryder of Austin, son Ricky Michael and daughter-in-law Debbie Michael of Hempstead, sister Sue Parks and her husband Cortney Parks of Huntsville, sister Minnie Lou Culp, sister Freda Brink of Travers City, Michigan , sister Jo Nell Hajovosky and her husband George of Houston, Fred Michael and his wife Kim of Houston, Sister Mary Beth Wilson of Bryan, brother Richard Michael and wife Judy of Kingwood. Visitation will be held at Sam Houston Memorial Funeral Home in Huntsville, Texas from 5:30 pm to 7:30 pm on Thursday December 18th. When I was growing up like many children, I looked outside my home for my heroes. I didn't have to look very far. I found my hero in my grandfather, Jack Vaughn. He was an athlete and a strong man with great character. Everywhere in Gainesville that I went, there was evidence to confirm my newfound hero. People would come out of the woodwork, look me in the eye, and tell me what a great man my grandfather was. I even wanted to have crow's feet like his, so I would squint and wink but could never achieve the desired trade marks. I never heard my grandfather once criticize or make trivial of something that any one valued no matter how ridiculous. He was a zen master and my chosen hero. Being the argumentative brother in the family, I often challenged and butted heads with my dad. One time on a driving trip to Gainesville, I had, in my mind, a great un-justice done to me by my dad over something now that was so trivial, I can't even remember what it was over. All I remember was the hurt and the anger. So, I got out of the car and searched out my hero, my grandfather, to tell on my dad. I was so sure that he would take my side because he was so fair and wise. I found him under a shade tree with his dogs and my uncle Don. I told Jack what

happened (I am sure in a bias way favoring my side). When I had finished, my grandpa, the greatest man I know, looked at me in a way I had never seen or have ever seen, and in a strong stern voice he looked me in eye and said, "Your dad is a great man, he is one of the greatest men I have ever known!" and got up and walked way with his dogs in tow. I stood there in total shock. Then, my uncle Don, who looked liked Steve Mc Queen's younger twin brother, looked down at me and said, "Ted has done more for this family than you will ever know" and also walked away. Jack knew then what we all know now in this room my dad was, and always will be, a great man! But now as I hear stories about my dad and read postings on the web site. I have realized once again how great he was. And now once again like that small child I once was, I realize once again how little of my fathers greatness that I knew. Don't get me wrong, I knew he had done many great things, but I had no idea of the magnitude. That is because he never boasted or bragged or even asked for a thank you. He just did it. Now, I look out and see all the people he had touched and who had touched him. And I just want to say thank you for sharing in his greatness and may we all go out of here today and continue to share his kindness, fairness and unselfish generosity with others. He is my Hero.
