“ One of my favorite remembrances when working with Ted at Marathon Morco involved the following: Ted would always relate this story of a large shoe company in New York who had saturated the US shoe market and were looking to go international. They hired a young sales person and dispatched him over to Africa to see if there was a market for shoes on that continent. After a few days, the shoe company headquarters received a wire from the sales person advising that he was returning home as everyone in Africa was bare footed, and they did not have any requirement for shoes. About one year later, the company decided to send another sales person to Africa. After a few days there, the sales person sends a message back. Send me all available shoe samples. Everyone is walking around barefooted, and everyone is a prospect. Ted and I used to refer to that story many times.

Every time I would come back from a sales trip and write up one of my sales reports, if there happened to be a company that would tell me they did not have any requirement for our specialty white oils, Ted would tell me, "Guess you are telling me they don't wear shoes". Sometimes it is the way you look at things, and Ted's message to me always was that you have to look at all of the angles or dig deep to make the sale. He was a wonderful person, devoted family man, and very loyal to his employers. I would occasionally ask Ted to go out to lunch when at work. He would always beg off and tell me that he had to get home to have lunch with Jewel. Then I would see him get into his Green Pinto and take off for League City. We know he is now in peace and has gone to Heaven.
