October 29, 1923 - July 9, 2007

Warren Jackson "Pap" Litman, 83, of Huntsville passed away peacefully on July 5, 2007 after a courageous battle with cancer. Warren was born on October 29, 1923 in Moundsville, WV. After graduation from high school, Warren joined the Army Air Corps as an aircraft radioman and served on Iwo Jima during World War II. Upon his return from the service, he was employed by the Fostoria Glass Co. for three years. He married Zena Duke, his wife of 62 years, on January 13, 1945 and they moved to Houston with two small children where he was employed by Armco Steel as an instrumentation and communication technician. He retired after 28 years of dedicated service. Music was Warren's "second language". He played guitar with a big band during his high school years and sang bass with the Houston Tidelanders, Elkins Lake Baptist Church Choir, and the Huntsville Community Men's Choir. Warren's great bass voice will be missed by these groups and by all who enjoyed his singing. In addition, Warren's dedicated service to the VFW and the H.E.A.R.T.S. Veterans Museum will be truly missed. He had volunteered at the museum since 1995, and had provided students and parents alike with colorful stories of his experiences during WWII and was truly a living example of the Greatest Generation. Preceding Warren in death are his parents, Nellie and Elmer Litman, and three sisters (Helen Butchko, Ruth Daniels and Jean Sabat all of Moundsville, WV). Family members surviving to cherish his memory are his wife Zena, son Ken Litman of Beaumont, daughter Kathy Hall of Huntsville, three grandchildren, and three

great grandchildren. Pap will be missed by everyone whose life he touched. He loved his family and friends. Quick with a smile, fast wit and slow to anger, he was a shining example of love and compassion. In lieu of flowers, the family has requested donations be made to the Huntsville H.E.A.R.T.S. Veteran's Museum or the Elkins Lake Baptist Church Building Fund in Warren's memory. Services will be held Monday July , 2007 at 1 PM at the Elkins Lake Baptist Church with Dr. Ken Huggins officiating. Interment will follow at Brooke Cemtery under the direction of Sam Houston Memorial Funeral Home. The family will receive friends from 4 to 6 PM Sunday afternoon at the funeral home.
