



Wilburn Ansley

February 12, 1926 - June 23, 2024

Reverend Wilburn Ansley, age 98, passed into Heaven June 23, 2024. He was born February 12, 1926, to John Samuel and Autie Ansley in Hemphill, Texas.

Wilburn married Betty Hellen Ashworth on July 11, 1945. They had been married for 68 years when Betty passed into Heaven on June 7, 2013. They had 2 sons Ray and David.

Before Wilburn and Betty married, he enlisted in the Army during World War II at the age of 17. During his enlistment he received several medals; Purple Heart, 3 Bronze, 3 Ribbons.

Wilburn was born again at the age of 24 in Buna, Texas. He surrendered to the ministry at the age of 25 and was ordained February 20, 1955. After surrendering to the ministry, Wilburn attended Lamar Tech in Beaumont, Texas. Before graduation and while attending Lamar Tech for 5 years he pastored 2 churches at the same time. In 2003, Rev. Wilburn Ansley was given an Honorary Doctorate Degree by the President of Covington University, Dr. Fred Guilbert, Jr.

He smiled and asked what I would like and I said Jesus in my heart, and Smiled and asked if I knew who Jesus was and what he had done for me, and what happened after he was buried, and I told him, and he then lead me in the sinners prayer...I was crying and I remember him saying, why are you crying so hard, and I had felt Jesus come into my heart, and what felt like a warm blanket surround me... I responded with, "because I love him so much"

I am thankful for Pastor Ansley and that Sunday school teacher, and my momma.

We loved that church, and how on fire Pastor Ansley would preach, and brother Willy in the choir shouting Amen. That's about all I recall because we moved about a year later or so to Oklahoma.
