William Donald Dawson was born on November 19, 1942 in East Bernard, Texas and passed away on October 17, 2019 in Huntsville, Texas.

Bill moved to Huntsville during Jr. High and excelled in sports during his high school years. He lettered in baseball, basketball, and football. He also became good friends with Evelyn Fitzgerald and finally asked her on a date their senior year. Their first date was to the prison rodeo October 16, 1960 with Bo Didley in concert.

Bill and Evelyn both attended Sam Houston State and married their senior year. After graduation, Bill started a long and successful career with the YMCA of The Greater Houston Area. During his 37 year career with the Y, Bill and Evelyn raised their two sons while living in Channelview, Conroe, Friendswood, and Pearland.
