Zula Long, 97, passed away peacefully at her home in Point Aquarius on Lake Conroe, Sunday, March 28, 2021.

Zula was born July 29, 1923 in Star, Oklahoma to Butler and Annie Lee Lewis Hansard. She would always say, “A star was born”, and that she was! Her family moved to Stillwater, Oklahoma when she was a toddler because her brother, John, received a football scholarship to what was then known as Oklahoma A&M. She worked as an executive secretary and property manager until 1976 when she and Bob decided to leave the Houston rat-race.
